

### Clue/Trigger Words- Preterite vs. Imperfect

<b>Preterit</b>	<b>Imperfect</b>
<p>Some words and phrases indicate specific time frames, and therefore signal the use of the <b>preterite</b>.</p>	<p>Other words and phrases indicate repetitive, vague or non-specific time frames, and therefore signal the use of the <b>imperfect</b>.</p>
